CALL TO ORDER

A meeting of the Rowan University/Rutgers—Camden Board of Governors was held on September 10, 2019 at the Joint Health Sciences Center, 201 South Broadway, Camden, New Jersey. The meeting was called to order by Mr. Collins at 12:00 p.m. Mr. Collins presided as chair of the meeting.

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT STATEMENT

Ms. Robinson read the Open Public Meetings Act Statement of Compliance.

ROLL CALL

At the direction of the Chair, Ms. Robinson took attendance by calling the roll and asked if there were any recusals to be noted for the record. No recusals were notes.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chair Collins asked everyone to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

**AGENDA CHANGES** 

Chair Collins asked if there were any agenda changes. CEO Dana Redd indicated there were none.

## **OPEN SESSION**

APPROVAL OF PRIOR MEETING MINUTES

**CEO REPORT** 

Chair Collins stated that in accordance with Board Resolution No. 2019-04-02, adopted on April 9, 2019, today's meeting was started in Executive Session at 11:00 a.m. Topics discussed in Executive Session were legal, acquisitions, and personnel. These matters were also discussed in open session. At that point, a motion was made, seconded, and approved unanimously to move into open session.

Chair Collins asked for a motion to approve the minutes from the Board's previous meeting held on July 9, 2019. A motion was made, seconded, and the minutes were approved unanimously.

On behalf of herself and her team, CEO Redd enthusiastically welcomed the Joint Board to the first official board meeting held at the Joint Health Sciences Center. CEO Redd provided an update on the Joint Health Sciences Center project and the Certified Medical Assistant and Alzheimer's Journey Coordinator Programs.

The construction phase of the Joint Health Sciences Center is near completion. The Joint Board's administrative team relocated to the building on August 12 and has been working with the facilities manager to transition the building from construction to operations and with Rowan University. Rutgers University-Camden, Camden County College, and Cooper Medical School of Rowan University to move into the building in September. A ribbon-cutting ceremony is planned for mid-October. A punch list has been issued to the contractor by the architects and engineers, and items on the list are being completed on a daily basis. Furniture has been delivered and installed throughout the building. The audio/visual contractor is working to make certain that the lobby media wall and technology systems in meeting and conference space are functioning. Cleaning crews are working to prep the space for occupation. All of the institutions have started setting up their equipment. Cooper Medical School of Rowan University, for example, has moved most of the equipment into the sim lab spaces. An RFP for artwork throughout the building has generated much interest from prominent artists and the media. Proposals are due on September 25. Use of the multi-purpose room for special events and meetings has also generated much interest, and several local and county organizations have booked the space.

With respect to the Certified Medical Assistant Program, the Joint Board's partnership with Hopeworks and Camden County College continues to be successful. All members of Cohort 3 have completed their coursework and are employed. Members of Cohort 4 completed a summer program at

Hopeworks and began classes at Camden County College on September 9. To facilitate the students' continued post-secondary education following completion of the Certified Medical Assistant Program, tours of Rutgers University—Camden, Rowan University at Glassboro, and Camden County College at Blackwood are planned.

With respect to the Alzheimer's Journey Coordinator Program, the Joint Board has obtained trademarks for "Alzheimer's Journey Coordinator" and "Alzheimer's Journey Coordinator Certificate Program" for printed instructional, educational, teaching materials, and for providing educational services. Institutions wishing to replicate this program must obtain permission from the Joint Board and Camden County College, ensuring their recognition as pioneers of this innovative educational program. A thorough evaluation of the first cohort has been completed in collaboration with Dr. David Edwards, Vice President of Academic Affairs at Camden County College. Dr. Michael Nester, Dean of Liberal Arts and Professional Studies at Camden County College, and the Advisory Committee. Recruitment of Cohort 2 is underway, and classes will begin on October 26 at the Joint Health Sciences Center.

Ms. Redd concluded by acknowledging the hard work of the Board and the dedication of her team: Dean D'Astuto, Director of Capital Projects, Sandy McAndrew, Executive Assistant, Paige Walker, Program and Policy Analyst, Ray Console, legal counsel, Steve Williams, accountant, Dan Keashen, Director of Public Affairs for Camden County, John Kosick, IT consultant, Dennis Hayes, Senior Project Manager for STV, Inc., and the facility management team of Jim Grant and Walt Werner. "Together," she said, "we strive to best represent the Board and to make you proud."
